
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Bridget Lambert West Virginia Retailers Association

The Expansion of Workforce **Opportunities in the Retail Industry**

Vendors serving the retail industry operate out of small and large distribution warehouses, moving their brands onto store shelves. Goods warehoused near our grocery and convenience stores provide the assurance that shelves can be stocked at a moment's notice.

The West Virginia Community College system promotes a job-driven focus for public/private partnerships. The Eastern Panhandle has proven time and again the importance of these partnerships for regional economic growth.

When Macy's chose to locate one of the largest fulfillment centers on the East Coast in Martinsburg, they partnered with Blue Ridge Community and Technical College to prepare a work-ready workforce. Macy's commissioned the construction of a fulfillment center that encompasses 2.1 million square feet and houses over 14 miles of conveyors. Core employment at the center is 1,240, with hundreds of seasonal employees hired each fall, offering a variety of part-time and full-time opportunities in the region.

Overall, the retail industry employs over 200,000 workers in West Virginia and is one of the largest industry segments in the state. We provide exceptional educational opportunities, upward mobility, and flexibility to those choosing a retail career.
